

WIV Report Guide:

WIV Federal Performance Report



Each section below contains information about each federal measure displayed on the WIV Federal Performance Report.

Definitions:

Denominator: The denominator described in each measure represents the pool of enrolled clients who *may* meet the criteria to be counted for the measure. The denominator is displayed as the grey portion of each measure's bar graph.

Numerator: The numerator described in each measure represents the pool of enrolled clients who meet the criteria to be counted for the measure. The numerator is displayed as the green portion of each measure's bar graph.

Filters used in this report:

The date filters will display data for actively enrolled clients within the selected dates. Users may also filter their data by Grantee, Organization, Home Visiting Model, and County.

Client lists:

Selecting either the denominator or numerator on a given measure will make the list on the right side of each report tab update to display that particular set of clients. Measures counting children will display their associated caregiver, and vice versa.

Report Guidance:**Enrollment Type:**

The WIHV Federal Performance Report only includes data from clients who were enrolled in Family Foundations Home Visiting (FFHV). If your program enters non-FFHV clients in DAISEY, those clients will not be included in the Federal Performance Report.

Prenatal Enrollment:

For prenatal focused measures, the WIHV Federal Performance Report only includes clients who initially enrolled in FFHV prenatally. A client will not be included in a prenatal focused measure if she initially enrolled in FFHV postpartum, even if she had a subsequent pregnancy and continued with services through that subsequent pregnancy. The following measures focus on prenatally enrolled mothers:

- Measure 1: Preterm birth
- Measure 2: Breastfeeding at age 6 months
- Measure 3: Depression screening
- Measure 5: Postpartum care

Quality Assurance Measures:

The following measures report on whether programs are completing assessments and/or providing appropriate follow-up according to FFHV and federal expectations. The WIHV Federal Performance Report can be used to monitor these measures regularly as a quality assurance check:

- Measure 3: Depression screening
- Measure 6: Tobacco cessation referrals
- Measure 10: Parent-child interaction assessments
- Measure 12: Developmental screening
- Measure 13: Behavioral concerns
- Measure 14: Intimate partner violence screening
- Measure 19: Intimate partner violence referrals

Transition from SPHERE to DAISEY:

FFHV transitioned from SPHERE to DAISEY in October 2016. For the time period October 2016 through September 2017, the report results for the following measures may not be accurate because we did not transfer assessment data from SPHERE to DAISEY:

- Measure 2: Breastfeeding at age 6 months
- Measure 3: Depression screening
- Measure 12: Developmental screening
- Measure 14: Intimate partner violence screening

When DCF reports data to the federal government in October 2017, SPHERE and DAISEY data will be combined to provide a complete and accurate report.
